RE: PRODUCTION SECTOR REPORT FY 2020/21

Introduction:

Kiboga district is located in the central region of Uganda about 85 Km along Kampala- Hoima high way. This main road to Hoima divides the district into two main parts, the predominantly cattle rearing part in the East and the crop growing area on the western side of the road.

Kiboga District Production sector comprises of Veterinary, agriculture/Crop, Fisheries, Entomology/vermin departments and NAADS/ Operation Wealth Creation (OWC) as across cutting programme. The sector is manned by District Production Officer (DPO) who oversees the sector activities in the district, Senior Agriculture Officer (SAO) in charge of all crop related issues, Senior Veterinary Officer (SVO) in charge of livestock, Senior Agriculture Engineer, Entomology officer and a Fisheries Officer. The OWC coordinator is an Army Officer who oversees implementation of NAADS/ OWC activities in the district.

At lower local councils (Sub Counties and Town Councils) each LLG has a Veterinary Officer and Agriculture Officer to offer extension services to farmers.

The **vision** of the Agricultural sector is: “A Competitive, Profitable and Sustainable Agricultural Sector”.

The **mission** is to “Transform subsistence farming to commercial agriculture

Sector Development Objectives/outputs

- Rural incomes and livelihoods increased
- Household food and nutrition security improved

Immediate Objectives

- Factor productivity (land, labour, capital) in crops, livestock, and fisheries sustainable enhanced
- Markets for primary and secondary agricultural products within Kiboga, Uganda, the region and beyond developed and sustained.

Mandates of Production sector

- ✓ Regulatory services through pests /parasite and disease control
- ✓ Collection and compilation of agricultural statistics/data
- ✓ Agricultural infrastructural development (post-harvest handling facilities-cribs, granaries, mills, roads, valley tanks e.t.c)
- ✓ Quality control assurance for increased production, food security and poverty reduction
- ✓ Provision of Advisory services
- ✓ Preparation of production and market work plans and strategic action plans
- ✓ Implementation of government production & marketing, programs, projects, policies and regulations.
- ✓ Provision of technical guidance and advice to the administration of the district and Council at all levels on production and marketing issues, programs and projects.
- ✓ Promotion of appropriate production and marketing technologies and best practices in the district.
- ✓ Identification of market potentials and advising the producers appropriately.

Therefore, the sector work plans and budgets are streamlined according to the above mandates.

Coffee, maize and cattle (beef and dairy) are the three main/ priority enterprises for Kiboga district promoted for food security and income generation. 95 % of the crop farmers in the District use rudimentary hand tools to grow crops. The soils are generally fertile though its fertility is declining due to over cultivation, environment degradation (charcoal burning and overgrazing), limited low use/ application of external inputs like inorganic fertilizers and manures to replenish soil fertility. Generally, the district is food secure and feeds other parts of the country with food stuffs especially maize, bananas, beans and animal products like milk, beef and ghee.

Production and productivity have increased from 55% in 2010/2011 to around 75% in 2019/2020 thanks to the intervention of NAADS programme through provision of technology inputs (planting materials and livestock breeds) to farmers and MAAIF through financial support (PMG and Extension grants), technical and material support (motorcycles and vehicle) to boost extension services delivery.

Commercial Farming

Commercialization of farming is mainly practiced in the Cattle colloidal area where local breeds of cattle and cross bred to improve production and productivity into dairy production. This is exhibited by improved livestock management practices such as Reduced stocking capacity, increasing number of dairy cattle breeds compared to local beef cattle breeds, increased milk production (150000 litres of milk per day is bulked) and increasing number of milk collection centers (21 milk coolers) and increasing dairy cooperatives (two vibrant dairy cooperatives namely Dwaniro Livestock dairy farmers' cooperative and Nyamiringa dairy farmers' cooperative in Kapeke S/c).

Commercialized farming is also common in coffee especially in Muwanga and Kibiga S/Cs. This is also exhibited by increasing number of 11 coffee hullers / processing factories in the district.

Horticultural crops such as Tomatoes, onions, Irish potatoes, cabbages, green pepper are also commercially grown in Lwamata S/C, Bukomero S/C and Kibiga S/C.

NGOs in Agriculture related activities in the district

1.SASAKAWA Global 2000 in Lwamata Town Council and Lwamata Sub County

- Was contracted by World Food program (WFP) to implement Agriculture Market Support program in Lwamata Sub County for a period of three years from August 2018. Through
 - Strengthening capacities of smallholder farmers to transform from subsistence farming to commercial agriculture.
 - Training of 187 households (79 males and 108 females) on post-harvest handling.
 - Training of 465 households (183 males and 292 females) in farming as a business.
 - Training of households in agriculture finance.
 - Establishment of 26 high Iron rich bean variety demonstration gardens.

2. Global Climate Change Alliance (GCCA)

Under the funding of the European Union and the Government of Belgium, GCCA will continue to operate in Lwamata, Kapeke and Dwaniro Sub Counties.

Main goal:

- To contribute to sustainable and gender transformation to improve livelihoods of rural populations of Kiboga district.

The GCCA three key result areas are:

1. Knowledge and institutional capacities for gender responsive climate change adaptations & mitigations strengthened.
2. Household income & climate resilient capacities improved in a gender responsive manner.
3. Ecosystem adaptive & mitigation capacities enhanced

3. Tick and Tick borne disease control Project

This is Funded by **Jica and Makerere University, Okahiro University and Kiboga DLG** being the implementing partners

Areas of operation: Lwamata S/c, Kapeke S/c and Dwaniro S/C.

Key activities in the preliminary stages include

- Sensitization and training of farmers on ticks and tick borne diseases and the project intended objectives.
- Demonstrations on tick control using appropriate acaricides
- Research on tick and borne diseases
- Laboratory referral for Tick borne diseases.

4. World Vision

Areas of Operation: Kibiga S/C in the parishes of Kibiga, Nkandwa, Kizinga, Kajjere and Degeya.

Key activities:

- Training of farmers in improved farming practices (Kitchen /back yard gardening) and provision of improved planting materials (vegetable production) to promote balanced household nutrition
- Farmer training on soil and water conservation practices and technologies.
- Dissemination of weather forecast information to farmers to guide timely farm operations.
- Training on disaster preparedness and environment protection.

5. Dairy Development Authority (DDA)

DDA is one of the parastatals of the Ministry of Agriculture, Animal Industry and Fisheries. It is responsible for regulation and development of the dairy industry in the country.

Areas of Operation: Dwaniro, Kapeke, Bukomero, Lwamata Sub Counties.

Main activities

- Conduct trainings on dairy management, pasture management, improvement and conservation.
- Inspection of Dairy/ milk collection centers for quality assurance in the dairy value chain

- In conjunction with OWC / NAADS, Dairy Development Authority supports farmer groups/ cooperatives with Milk coolers in Kapeke, Dwaniro and Lwamata S/Cs.

6. MOBIP

Operates in Kapeke S/C and Dwaniro Sub Counties to improve livestock feeding through improved pasture establishment, conservation and dry season feeding.

Key challenges encountered

- High farmer to Extension ratio (1: 3,500) compared to the recommended 1: 500) and wider coverage.
- Budgets cuts especially for the planned capital investments i.e a budget cut of 84 million in 2019/20 to 68million in 2020/21.
- Inadequate transport means for the field staff resulting into sharing of the transport means.
- Pests (ticks, tick resistance to most acaricides, Coffee twig borer, fruit flies) and diseases (Foot and Mouth Disease –FMD) out breaks including Covid – 19 pandemic
- Fake agro – inputs on market (agro-chemicals, seeds, equipment) and high prices hinders adoption of some technologies.
- Climate change and unpredictable weather changes hinders timely farm operations like timely seedbed preparation, timely planting, weeding, harvesting).
- Un funded priorities like water for Production and small scale irrigation
